Programs

Summer Reading Initiative

In June and July the Friends of the Library Rourk Branch, in conjunction with Shallotte Kiwanis, Smart Start, Brunswick Family Assistance, the Literacy Council and the Rourk Library, participated in a summer reading initiative to bring reading intervention to Supply Elementary students at Cardinal Pointe. For a variety of reasons these children were unable to go to the Rourk Library to participate in the summer reading program. For nine Fridays FOL volunteers gathered at



Cardinal Pointe and worked with elementary students reading books aloud, as well as leading songs, games and activities which were planned by Kelly James, Rourk Library manager, to coincide with the library's summer reading program. The project required extensive planning for months in advance, program coordination, purchasing supplies, and even cleaning and organizing the space at Cardinal Pointe to host a welcoming environment for the children. Student numbers for the program changed over the weeks, but there were 22-24 children between the ages of 5 and 12 positively impacted by the library portion of the program. The FOL worked closely with other community groups to foster reading and learning in a community setting, while promoting library programming.



Veteran's StoryWalk



Last fall the Friends collaborated with Shallotte Kiwanis, creating a StoryWalk[©] for the Veterans Memorial area with the first annual Field of Honor at Mulberry Park. The flags and Story Walk[©] were up throughout November. A Story Walk[©] allows parents and children to walk along and read a book together, in this case about veterans in the neighborhood. This collaboration promoted the library in the community, encouraged reading in new and fun ways, and honored our veterans.

Ways and Means has met several times to organize and prioritize the changing funding needs of the Rourk Branch Library. While we were disappointed when funding for the library renovation plans were not realized, this group began exploring the notion of raising money for capital improvements as well as organizing some political/lobbying action to bring the needs for library renovations repeatedly before the county commissioners. A sample letter has been developed as a model and in early August was ready for distribution to FOL and mailing to the commissioners. Additional funding opportunities are being considered for library enhancements. One goal is to purchase benches and tables to enhance our Eco Space site for outdoor projects.

This year grant writer **Suzanne Gurski** won a grant to provide more large print books for patrons who need a larger font to enjoy reading. We were awarded the BEMC grant for our project entitled" The Better to See and Hear." The award of \$500 helped the library purchase more large print books. When the Friends of the Library Rourk Branch, needed a new logo, Megan Ybarra, a West Brunswick High School senior, stepped up, along with other students in Ms. Karwacki's yearbooks class. Megan's design was selected for the new Friends of the Library logo and will be featured in all FOL publications and social media sites starting this month. Megan was awarded a certificate of achievement and a fifty-dollar gift card. The Friends of the Library is a nonprofit group which supports the Rourk Branch of the Brunswick County Library through fundraising and volunteering.

Megan, who is an active reader, and loves Ray Bradbury, said her design was meant to be a coastal symbol without being corny. She is very active at school, including the National Honor Society, Key Club, and robotics. She is a member of the yearbook and loves film making and photography. She is planning to attend college at either Loyola of Chicago or Boston University, where she wants to study journalism and biology.

The FOL is grateful to all the students who participated, to their teacher, Crystal Karwacki, and especially to Megan, who has created a new public image for the FOL.

What We've Accomplished

What we did and why:

October Board Meeting: Established working committees to facilitate reaching goals for the year; 7 committees put in volunteer hours to accomplish many goals throughout the year.

Publicity Committee: This hard-working group expanded/redesigned the newsletter now sent though a MailChimp account, using our own Gmail account. Our Facebook account was placed under new leadership and redesigned to get our organization out into the world. A first ever, brand new website was designed, funded, and launched this year, updating our publicity information and reaching more people. They also created a new membership/information brochure in the form of a rack card, similar to the other branch library Friends groups. The rack cards have been put with the Friends display and have been reprinted twice already. These cards give our group a professional public face.

School Liaison Committee met with both the West Brunswick High School and Shallotte Middle School librarians to offer support for any programs or ideas they had about partnering with the public library. As a result, the Friends teamed with the high school yearbook adviser to sponsor a logo contest. Students designed logos. The logos were reviewed by the board members, and a winner was chosen from among the entries. The winning student had her picture published in the Brunswick Beacon and on the state site, FONCPL. She was awarded a certificate and a gift card. The new logo has been used on the rack membership card, our newsletters, and any publications we have created. Using the logo has boosted our public recognition, and given a professional, polished look to our publications. Students in the high school also participated in an essay contest sponsored by Kiwanis for the Field of Honor. The school liaison committee collected the essays and chose a winner in collaboration with Kiwanis and the Literacy Council. This small project allowed the FOL to work closely with community groups to foster reading and literacy.





Book Committee: In addition to regular sorting of the many books donated to the library, the members of this dedicated committee gave many hours to marketing books at the Mulberry Farmer's Market all summer long. They not only made money through generous donations from the market-goers but provided lots of public interaction between the library and the public. The committee also donated books to the county jail and took books to local charities. The money raised from book

donations helps the FOL purchase needed supplies, equipment, and enhancements at Rourk Library all year long.

Membership Committee: The Membership committee has wrestled with the notion of delineating a specific membership year, based on either the fiscal year (July-June) or the calendar year. A decision will be made in the new fiscal year. The committee decided to notify members at the usual August time, letting them know that when they join or renew, their membership term will end in December of 2023. The membership committee has also agreed to try something new—about 100 renewals were sent through the MailChimp email account to those subscribed to the newsletter. The remaining membership renewals were sent in the post. Results will be assessed for future mailing plans. Membership committee plans span last fiscal year and the current year.

Finance - Upgrade to Money Minder

Money Minder is a simplified booking software that meets our needs without a large expense or extensive training. It manages the membership information, budget, bank account(s), and expense categories. In addition, the software provides for our future plan to take online donations or membership renewals via our new website.

The switch to Money Minder bookkeeping software was approved by the Board of Directors at the July 14th meeting. This software is cloud/browser based and eliminates the need for specific operating systems or applications.

Outreach - FOL officers have spoken to community groups such as the Women's Club and the Newcomer' Club. We were able to reach a good number of people who were supportive of our goals and either donated money or joined the FOL.

Rourk Year in Review Kelly James

The library has been trying to get back to normal (post Covid) throughout the 2021/2022 fiscal year. Some of the year's highlights include the following:

- Subscription Read Boxes for preK-5th grade: Boxes changed each month, with different books and incentives. Twenty-five families per month enjoyed this version of StoryTime until we returned to regular StoryTime. This program was made possible with funding from our FOL and Walmart.
- **StoryTime:** StoryTime resumed in person in March 2022. We are having great attendance and everyone loves being back at the Library. StoryTime meets Thursdays at 11:00 am.
- League of Legendary Readers: A new tween/teen graphic novel Summer Reading program that we developed, League of Legendary Readers, was a huge success. We registered 39 participants in this popular program. They had a game card and completed levels by reading graphic novels. Participants loved the graphic novels and the cool prize incentives including fidget bracelets that were provided by our FOL.
- Ocean of Possibilities: The library registered 141 children for our summer reading program, Ocean of Possibilities. The children loved being back in the library for programming. In June, children participated in a Storywalk[™], a visit from Fort Fisher Aquarium, and had a boat craft and race day. The Summer Reading Program was supported by the FOL who paid for performers, craft materials, and prize incentives.
- **ecoExplore:** In 2022, our Library received an ecoExplore grant from the NC Arboretum. We are now an ecoExplore hotspot. This program includes free nature backpacks for checkout to explore nature and free nature programming provided by the NC science museum of Whiteville. Our FOL hopes to expand our wildlife viewing area at the library next year by providing some outdoor seating, planting pollinator plants, and installing birdfeeders. - **Battle of the Books:** Our FOL provided our middle school and elementary school Battle of the Books List for the 2021/2022 school year.
- Launchpad learning tablets: The Library purchased ten new Launchpad learning tablets for children PreK-High School, bringing our collection to twenty tablets. These tablets were introduced in 2021 and funded by generous donations to our FOL from individuals, Women's Club, and Rotary Club.
- Watercolor class: In 2021, our Library received a grant from the Brunswick Arts Council to conduct a zoom watercolor class with 15 participants.
- **Libby:** Please check out our new digital reading app, Libby, new in 2022. Our FOL generously contributed to adding new titles for our launching of Libby/Overdrive.
- Take home craft kits: The FOL provided craft material for take-home craft kits as another replacement for StoryTime. We handed out an average of 60 kits per month!


- **Rourk Book Club:** In 2021, our Book Club stayed strong by meeting via zoom and off premises. In March of 2022, our Book Club was able to start meeting at the Library once again and attendance has been strong. Many thanks to those who kept this club going and to our FOL for providing some book funding for this group.
- **AARP tax preparers:** Back by popular demand, AARP tax preparers returned in February by Appt. only after not being here for two seasons. This is one of our most popular adult programs.
- **Clubs:** Our Crochet group and Adult Coloring group are also happy to be back at the Library and new members are welcome! Call the Library for more information.

Treasurer's Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Report Footnotes

This year we increased our income over last year's since the library was open more to the public due to the decline in Covid. However, due to the significant increase in the summer youth programs we spent more than we had in the previous year. We consider this a very successful financial year with many accomplishments and an increase in our ending balance.

Income

Memorials – Increased donations, \$320, from the Rivers Edge Book Club in memory of a beloved member of their group.

Grants - \$1,000 from Lori Martin for new circulation desk and \$500 from BEMC for large print books.

Other Income – GFWC-SBI \$500; Newcomers Club \$50; Rivers Edge Book Club \$950 for Launch Pads; Kathy Hindmarsh, \$25 for new circulation desk; Judy Vasile, \$100; Bentwood Women's Club \$100; State Sales Tax Refund \$467.

CD/CD Transfer – The CD has been cashed and the funds will now appear as part of our general balance.

Expenses

Equipment – Purchased a library cart, telephones and a laptop cooling pack and case.


Movies – No movies were purchased this year.

Youth Programs – Completed a variety of special, summer programming, including an offsite program for children at Cardinal Pointe. Spent a tad more than our \$3500 budget.

Memorial Items – An increase to the books bought in Memoriam due to the generous donation in memory of a book club member.

Audio books/Books – We spent more than expected due to the funds made available for large print books from the BEMC grant and for launch pads made possible from donations from FOL.

Grants (Expenses)- No grants were provided this year to other 501c3 nonprofit groups.
