Dear Friends,

The Friends of the Library found the past year exciting, while at the same time both challenging and daunting. Change is often hard. Although a lot has been changing, we are learning that change is how we expand and develop our skills. As president of the Friends of the Library at Rourk Branch, I am proud of the scope of the accomplishments of the FOL Board this year as we embraced those changes.

Many thanks are owed to FOL members individually and collectively who advocated for these upgrades, making changes evident to all who enter the library.

Ways and Means

The Friends of the Library (FOL), supporting the Rourk Branch Library in Shallotte, is extremely excited to launch our first year-long quarterly visiting author series. On Thursday, September 28, 2023, we will welcome renowned novelist Wiley Cash as guest speaker at the FOL Annual Meeting to be held at the Brunswick Electric Membership Corporation meeting room. It is anticipated that upwards of 100 community members will flock to the gathering as Wiley Cash is an award-winning New York Times best-selling author. Key to the success of this gathering, as well as the launch of the visiting author series, is the support of many good friends, business partners and organizations in the Shallotte community.

The Friends of the Library support library projects that encourage reading and lifelong learning, increase library access to the public, support and encourage local authors and promote librarianship as a career. Our priority funding focus areas enhance library offerings:

- S.T.E.A.M kits, available for check out at no cost to the patron, are designed for ages 2-12 years old and help families explore Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math in fun and interactive ways
- Healthy Aging will provide memory kits and more to the growing senior population in our community

• Outdoor EcoSpace on the library grounds is evolving to bring the community up close and personal with local flora, fauna and wildlife.

The visiting author series is just one of many ways Friends of the Library is working to engage our community in the multitude of educational, entertaining, and inspirational offerings hosted by our local library.

Grantwriting Committee

Grants are a challenging task. With donations to charities down, more organizations are turning to grants to make up the shortfall. In 2023 the Grants Committee applied for 3 grants with one winner, the application to the Brunswick County Arts Council for a 6-week painting class with artist Joan Hoyle was successful. The class held this summer was well attended.

We were not as fortunate with our 2 other grant applications. A grant to the FOCUS for Alzheimer/Dementia kits and a large grant for \$10,000 to the Catherine Kennedy Home Foundation in Wilmington for an expanded version of the Alzheimer's kits with educational seminars. At this time, we will continue to seek funding for the Alzheimer's kits from alternative sources.

Book Committee

As people around the county donate books to the library, many of those books are not needed for the library collection. The remainder of the donations are sorted and used for several things. First of all, the FOL offers some of those books to patrons for donations. There is a box in the library for these donations on the honor system. Second, books that are not going to be used on the donation shelves are shared throughout the community.

Rourk FOL shares some of the donated materials and books with the Hope Chest Thrift Store, which benefits the only women's domestic violence shelter in the county. We also donated some children's books for all ages to the Hope Harbor Home. The staff and others are always thanking the volunteer who takes the books to them, so she shares their gratitude with all of the Rourk friends.

Another beneficiary of our unused donated books is Arbor Landing. The library at Arbor Landing also appreciates our recycling books to them. Through the FOL book committee, books find their way around the county and into homes. This is an activity of which we are proud.

Membership Committee

The Membership Committee, JoAnn Bass, John Causey, and Sheila Umbricht want to thank the members who renewed their commitment to Rourk Friends. Although we had 24 people who did not renew, we welcomed 27 new members, bringing total membership to 125. We thank you all for your financial support. Because of your generous contributions, we met and surpassed our budget goal. This was the first year we tried emailing membership renewal forms. Thank you to all who provided their email addresses. We were able to save on postage and copying. Less than 20 members are without emails. With the membership dues the FOL can continue to enhance the library experience of

all our patrons.

What we did and why:

New Front Bench!

The Friends of the Library Board Director Lori Martin has been a tireless advocate, both for the library, and lately for the renovations we have finally received. As part of her efforts to provide a more modern and workable circulation desk, she donated a generous sum of money to help us make that happen. As it turned out, her advocacy helped spur the creation of a new circ desk from county funds, and thus her money could be used in other ways.



A wish of the Rourk Library Manager Kelly James was to have a sturdy bench out front for patrons to wait on, read on, or on which to get themselves organized. Thanks to Lori Martin's donation, we were able to buy a beautiful outdoor bench that fits perfectly near the front doors. This new bench is part of the whole new look for Rourk: new sign painting, bench, carpet, circ desk, and meeting room. What a wonderful gift.

Notable Children's Books

The Friends of the Library Rourk Branch recently purchased 61 new children's books and created a display for the books at Rourk Library. These books are special because each one received a Notable Children's Book Award from the Association for Library Service to Children. A Notable award means the book is of commendable quality, exhibits venturesome creativity, and reflects and encourages children's interests in exemplary ways.



These books include winners of many distinguished awards such as the Coretta Scott King Award for continuing the work of MLK for peace and brotherhood; the Pura Belpre Award for celebrating Latino culture; the Theodore Geisel Award for a book with art, imagination and creativity that engages beginning readers; the Robert Sibert Award for the best informational book; the Caldecott Medal, for the most distinguished art; The Newberry Award for the most distinguished literature for a children's book; and the Mildred J. Batchelder Award for books written outside of the US, not written in English.

This purchase was made possible because of donations from the Rivers Edge Book Club, John and Georianna Folkins and River's Edge Ladies Golf Association. The Book Club collected funds in memoriam for one of their members who had been an educator of young children, Sandy Keck. The funds were presented to the Friends of the Library Rourk Branch and they were specified for the purchase suitable books for young readers at Rourk Library.

Karen Robbins, the President of the Friends of the Library Rourk Branch, said "It was an honor for the Friends of the Library to help bring this exciting collection of new books to Rourk Library on behalf of the Rivers Edge Book Club, in memory of their friend, Sandra Keck, who loved both books and learning. We thank them for their continued support of our library, so that all young readers in Brunswick County have access to these distinguished new books."

StoryWalk®



The Rourk Branch Friends of the Library made Earth Day special for families in Shallotte. Using the children's book, Earth Day Every Day by Lisa Bullard and illustrated by Xiao Xin, and working in cooperation with the City of Shallotte, the StoryWalk® was installed along a portion of the city's Riverwalk.



As families walked along the beautiful nature trail, they read about things we can do every day to help the earth. Young readers found activities on each page, so as they walked and read, they also enjoyed physical fitness moves to try.

We want to give special recognition to Megan Bellamy from the City of Shallotte and Parks and Recreation department, who not only installed the Walk for us, but publicized it on their Facebook page. Many thanks.









Last November 2022, the Friends of the Library installed a StoryWalk® in Partnership with Shallotte Kiwanis. Some may have seen the book Veterans: Heroes in our Neighborhood by Valerie Phunstein, at Mulberry Park both in November of 2021 and 2022 at the Flags on Honor Memorial sponsored by Shallotte Kiwanis. Thanks to Bob von Sprecken, president of Kiwanis, for allowing us to be part of Veterans Day. We hope to continue the tradition of placing interesting books with physical fitness activities at other places around the local area.

The Rourk Library has recently joined NC ECOEXPLORE and is an ecoExplore Hotspot.

The library received a \$200 grant from the NC Arboretum to install a wildlife viewing station in the newly cleared backyard. This program and grant provided a birdbath viewing station, sponsored by the NC Arboretum and various other agencies such as the North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences. This program/grant also provides three backyard ecoExplore discovery backpacks available for checkout and free inhouse and zoom programming on Nature. Families can learn more about the eco Explore program by visiting http://ecoexplore.net and backpacks can be checked out for 7 days.







School Liaison Committee Report

One Book for every 5th Grade Student at Supply Elementary

Rourk Friends of the Library works each year with the local schools to develop a close relationship between the schools and the library.

This year, in May, every fifth grade student at Supply Elementary received the book *Save Me a Sea*t by Gita Varadarajan as they prepared to leave elementary school and head to middle school in the fall.



The book was purchased with FOL funds and the title was suggested by the fifth grade teaching team at Supply Elementary. Librarian Kasey Mcgougan was the liaison between the FOL and the school.

Karen Robbins, FOL Rourk president, went to the school to personally hand the books to each student and speak to the classes about the library. From her perspective, it was a great day! It continued a precedent of sharing books and library information over the years.













Teen Spotlight

This year the FOL has invited Grace Watson to be a part of our FOL Board of Directors as a teen representative. Our library director Patricia Dew and library manager Kelly James have been interested in creating a welcoming teen space inside Rourk Library. The timing could not have been better as Grace is filled with ideas and suggestions that she believes will encourage teens to start coming to the library again.



Grace Watson is an incoming senior at West Brunswick High School. She is committed to service and sharing her love of literature with her peers and community. In her spare time, Grace surfs, bakes, and reads. Grace is the founder and president of the West Brunswick High School Book Club. In honor of Women's History Month, the club reads The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue. The Book Club attracts all characters of West Brunswick. It provides the opportunity to offer unique perspectives on literature and life. In addition to her book club, Grace founded a backpack program that includes hygiene items for incarcerated juveniles. She hopes to expand upon this initiative and offer various novels to detained individuals. Grace is passionate about literature and hopes to share further her love of reading with her peers.

She aims to create a safe space for all teens through the public library. Grace is a very busy student and class officer, maintaining high grades while working. We hope to include her as often as possible for board meetings, for smaller meetings to help us brainstorm and design a friendly teen space, and to lead our efforts to bring teens to the library.

Some of her ideas include: an Instagram account; monthly staff picks and reviews; "Movie vs Book Night" to discuss movies developed from novels; Community Themed nights; partnership with local fitness center where teens like to hangout and train—just to name a few. She is a leader in National Honor Society as well and said that they all need volunteer hours, so we should partner with the NHS to get volunteers for special events.

Grace's voice is a welcome addition to our Board, and to our library.





Helen Pate moved from here from Raleigh in 2017 and had time on her hands. She began using the Rourk library and very soon after that, she asked about how to join the volunteer program. She has contributed her time ever since. Last year, she became the volunteer coordinator. The duties include keeping track of the hours each volunteer works per month. She keeps a calendar that shows when they will be out for their volunteering day. Knowing ahead of time, other volunteers are encouraged to fill in if possible. Volunteers primarily shelve books but can be asked to assist in other ways. This group of twelve regulars (and one student volunteer on Saturdays) have already put in about 500 hours this year ... a very reliable and dedicated group.


Diana Dornfeld—Trustee District 2 Shallotte





